FOREWORD

This document, which is a revision of NBS SP 649 <u>Directory of International and Regional Organizations Conducting Standards-Related Activities</u>, is one of a series of publications designed to provide information on national, regional, and international organizations which participate in standards-related activities. There are 338 international and regional organizations listed in this directory, 66 more organizations than were listed in the first edition, which was published in 1983. Part of this increase is due to a growing number of European organizations which have become active in standards efforts in Europe, and part is due to the inclusion of organizations only identified after the publication of the 1983 edition. The listed organizations conduct standardization, certification, laboratory accreditation or other standards-related activities. This volume describes their work in these areas, as well as each organization's scope of activity and the national affiliations of members. It also lists the names and addresses of U.S. participants where they have been identified.

One hundred eighty nine organizations have U.S. members and an additional 18 organizations are open to the United States, though there is no U.S. member. Thirty-two U.S. organizations hold only limited membership, such as corresponding member or observer. In a few cases, this is by choice. Ninety-seven organizations indicated that they were not open to the United States, though some of these maintain a liaison with their U.S. counterparts. Most of the organizations which are not open to U.S. participation are regional industry organizations in Europe. Several organizations did not respond to questions regarding U.S. membership.

The information contained in this directory is based primarily on information provided by the listed organizations and therefore reflects the organization's view of its activities, though information from other sources was used to complete some of the entries.

This volume supports an effort by the National Institute of Standards and Technology (formerly the National Bureau of Standards) to provide information related to multinational standards-related activities. It is designed to serve the needs of federal agencies and standards writers for information on international and regional organizations. Manufacturers, engineers, purchasing agents, and others may also find this volume of value.

ABSTRACT

This directory contains information on 338 international and regional organizations which conduct standardization, certification, laboratory accreditation, or other standards-related activities. This volume describes their work in these areas, the scope of each organization, national affiliations of members, U.S. participants, restrictions on membership, as well as the availability of any standards in English.

This volume is designed to serve the needs of federal agencies and standards writers for information on international and regional organizations involved in standardization and related activities. It may also be useful to manufacturers, engineers, purchasing agents, and others.

INTRODUCTION

International standards and implementing actions, the importance of which have only recently been recognized, affect the flow of goods among nations. In the late 1960's, a multi-national working group of the General Agreement on Tariffs and Trade (GATT) began to draft an agreement regarding the use of standards and certification systems in international trade. This effort was transferred to the Tokyo Round of the Multilateral Trade Negotiations (MTN) in 1975. These negotiations led to the Agreement on Technical Barriers to Trade, which entered into force on January 1, 1980. Title IV of the U.S Trade Agreements Act of 1979 implemented the United States' responsibilities under this Agreement.

The Agreement encourages signatories to participate in international standards organizations with a view towards harmonizing individual countries' technical regulations. The Trade Agreements Act (TAA) of 1979 assigns to the Department of Commerce the responsibility of assuring that U.S. participation in such organizations is adequate to represent U.S. interests.

The National Institute of Standards and Technology (NIST) (formerly the National Bureau of Standards) has developed this directory as part of its responsibilities under the TAA. It seeks to identify organizations engaged in standards development, certification, laboratory accreditation, and related activities, and which have identified themselves through their organizational titles as being international or regional in character or have been thus referred to in other international and regional organizational directories. Another purpose is to identify those organizations which are open to U.S. participation and whether or not the United States is represented.

Organizations, such as the American Society of Mechanical Engineers, the American Society for Testing and Materials, the British Standards Institution, the Canadian Standards Association, and Deutsches Institut fur Normung, produce standards which may be used in many parts of the world, but have designated themselves by title as national organizations; they have not been listed herein. However, further information on organizations located in the United States is contained in a companion volume to this directory, SP 681 Standards Activities of Organizations in the United States. Information of U.S. certification activities can be found in SP 739 Directory of Federal Government Certification Programs and SP 703 Private Sector Product Certification Programs in the United States. A list of publications of potential interest to the reader is included in the Appendix.

The information in this directory was obtained from responses to a questionnaire which was sent to more than 800 organizations listed in NIST files or in available international and regional organizational directories as likely sites for standards-related activities. Follow-up letters were sent to organizations which did not respond to the initial inquiry. Of the organizations which responded, 338 indicated they participate in standards-related activities. NIST would appreciate receiving information on other organizations which should be included in any updated or expanded version of this directory.

It is the responsibility of the Council to decide whether or not to adopt the proposed directive. The "New Approach" depends heavily on the existence of European standards. These will be prepared (usually by CEN and CENELEC) on the basis of "mandates" agreed upon with the Commission.

They may wish to consult on the content of CEN/CENELEC's work and on their draft standards, to supply CEN/CENELEC with documents intended as draft European standards, and to help define the broad lines of the overall European policy on standardization.

IAEA prepares two types of documents, Codes of Practice and Safety Guides. The Codes establish the principal objectives and requirements that must be fulfilled to ensure adequate nuclear power plant safety. The Safety Guides recommend procedures and acceptable technical solutions to implement the requirements and achieve the objectives of the Codes. IAEA develops nuclear safety standards for adoption by member states regarding the regulation, siting, design, operation and quality assurance systems for nuclear power plants.

This booklet explains the basic rules of the international Agreement on Technical Barriers to Trade negotiated during the Tokyo Round of the Multilateral Trade Negotiations (MTN), and describes Title IV of the U.S. Trade Agreements Act of 1979 which implements the United States' obligations under the Agreement. The Agreement, popularly known as the Standards Code, was designed to eliminate the use of standards and certification systems as barriers to trade. The booklet describes the functions of the Departments of Commerce and Agriculture, the Office of the U.S. Trade Representative, and the State Department in carrying out the U.S.'s responsibilities.

o GATT Standards Code Activities

This brochure gives a brief description of NIST's activities in support of the Standards Code. These activities include operating the U.S. GATT inquiry point for information on standards and certification systems; notifying the GATT Secretariat of proposed U.S. regulations; assisting U.S. industry with traderelated standards problems; responding to inquiries on foreign and U.S. proposed regulations; and preparing reports on the Standard Code.

o <u>GATT Standards Code Activities of the National Bureau of Standards</u>
This annual report describes the GATT Standards Code activities conducted by the Office of Standards Code and Information for each calendar year. NIST responsibilities include operating the GATT inquiry point, notifying the GATT Secretariat of proposed U.S. federal government regulations which may affect trade, assisting U.S. industry with standards-related trade problems, and responding to inquiries about proposed foreign and U.S. regulations.

o <u>Report to the United States Congress on the Agreement on Technical Barriers to Trade - "Standards Code"</u>

This triennial report describes the programs and activities established to implement the Standards Code in the United States by the four responsible U.S. government agencies: Office of the U.S. Trade Representative; Department of Commerce (National Institute of Standards and Technology, International Trade Administration); Department of Agriculture and Department of State.

o GATT Hotline

A telephone hotline provides current information received from the GATT Secretariat in Geneva, Switzerland, on proposed foreign regulations which may significantly affect trade. The recorded message is updated weekly and gives the product, country, closing date for comments (if any) and Technical Barriers to Trade (TBT) notification number. The hotline number is (301) 975-4041 (not toll-free).

o NCSCI provides assistance to U.S. and foreign exporters in obtaining current standards, regulations and certification information for the manufacture of products. To aid foreign exporters, NCSCI also provides directory information of state offices prepared to respond to queries concerning conditions to be met by goods for sale in their state.
