¶72.28 PROVIDING FOR THE CONSIDERATION OF CONFERENCE REPORT AND AMENDMENTS IN DISAGREEMENT ON H.R. 5132

Mr. BEILENSEN, by direction of the Committee on Rules, reported (Rept. No. 102-578) the resolution (H. Res. 491) providing for the consideration of the conference report and amendments reported from conference in disagreement on the bill (H.R. 5132) making dire emergency supplemental appropriations for disaster assistance to meet urgent needs because of calamities such as those which occurred in Los Angeles and Chicago, for the fiscal

year ending September 30, 1992, and for other purposes.

When said resolution and report were referred to the House Calendar and ordered printed.

¶72.29 PROVIDING FOR THE CONSIDERATION OF H.R. 5099

Mr. BEILENSEN, by direction of the Committee on Rules, called up the following resolution (H. Res. 486):

*Resolved.* That at any time after the adoption of this resolution the Speaker may, pursuant to clause 1(b) of rule XXIII, declare the House resolved into the Committee of the Whole House on the State of the Union for the consideration of the bill (H.R. 5099) to provide for the restoration of fish and wildlife and their habitat in the Central Valley of California, and for other purposes, and the first reading of the bill shall be dispensed with. All points of order against consideration of the bill for failure to comply with the provisions of clause 2(l)(6) of rule XI are hereby waived. After general debate, which shall be confined to the bill and the amendments made in order by this resolution and which shall not exceed sixty minutes, to be equally divided and controlled by the chairman and ranking minority member of the Committee on Interior and Insular Affairs, the bill shall be considered for amendment under the five-minute rule. It shall be in order to consider the amendment in the nature of a substitute recommended by the Committee on Interior and Insular Affairs now printed in the bill as an original bill for the purpose of amendment under the five-minute rule, each section shall be considered as having been read, and all points of order against said substitute are hereby waived. It shall be in order to consider en bloc the amendments numbered 1 printed in the report of the Committee on Rules accompanying this resolution, and said amendments en bloc shall not be subject to a demand for a division of the question in the House or in the Committee of the Whole. All points of order against the amendments numbered 2 and 3 printed in the report of the Committee on Rules for failure to comply with the provisions of clause 7 of rule XVI are hereby waived. At the conclusion of the consideration of the bill for amendment, the Committee shall rise and report the bill to the House with such amendments as may have been adopted, and any Member may demand a separate vote in the House on any amendment adopted in the Committee of the Whole to the bill or to the committee amendment in the nature of a substitute. The previous question shall be considered as ordered on the bill and amendments thereto to final passage without intervening motion except one motion to recommit with or without instructions.

SEC. 2. After passage of H.R. 5099, it shall be in order to consider a motion to take from the Speaker's table the bill (H.R. 429) to authorize additional appropriations for the construction of the Buffalo Bill Dam and Reservoir, Shoshone Project, Pick-Sloan Missouri Basin Program, Wyoming, with the Senate amendment thereto, and to concur in the Senate amendment with an amendment consisting of the text of the bills H.R. 429 and H.R. 5099 as passed by the House. The House amendment to the Senate amendment and the Senate amendment shall be considered as having been read. The previous question shall be considered as ordered on the motion to final adoption without intervening motion. All points of order against the motion are hereby waived.

SEC. 3. Following adoption of the motion made in order by section 2 of this resolution, it shall be in order to move that the House
