

SEC. 202. PROCEDURES FOR JOINT REVIEW OF RESEARCH PROPOSALS.

The Under Secretary, in consultation with the Program Director, and jointly with the Director of the National Science Foundation and the Secretary of the Navy, shall—

(1) develop procedures for the submittal and joint review of proposals for research in priority research areas to be carried out with assistance from 2 or more agencies within the Department of Commerce, the National Science Foundation, or the Department of Defense; and

(2) issue final rules establishing those procedures by not later than 1 year after the date of the enactment of this Act.

SEC. 203. COMPLIANCE WITH BUY AMERICAN ACT.

No funds appropriated pursuant to this Act may be expended by an entity unless the entity agrees that in expending the assistance the entity will comply with sections 2 through 4 of the Act of March 3, 1933 (41 U.S.C. 10a-10c, popularly known as the "Buy American Act").

SEC. 204. SENSE OF CONGRESS; REQUIREMENT REGARDING NOTICE.

(a) PURCHASE OF AMERICAN-MADE EQUIPMENT AND PRODUCTS.—In the case of any equipment or product that may be authorized to be purchased with financial assistance provided under this Act, it is the sense of the Congress that entities receiving such assistance should, in expending the assistance, purchase only American-made equipment and products.

(b) NOTICE TO RECIPIENTS OF ASSISTANCE.—In providing financial assistance under this Act, the Under Secretary of Commerce for Oceans and Atmosphere shall provide to each recipient of the assistance a notice describing the statement made in subsection (a) by the Congress.
