85.6 WAIVING POINTS OF ORDER AGAINST H.R. 5518

Mr. GORDON, by direction of the Committee on Rules, called up the following resolution (H. Res. 513):

Resolved, That during consideration of the bill (H.R. 5518) making appropriations for the Department of Transportation and related agencies for the fiscal year ending September 30, 1993, and for other purposes, all points of order against provisions in the bill for failure to comply with clause 2 of rule XXI are waived except as follows: beginning with "Provided" on page 4, line 24, through page 5, line 2; beginning on page 63, line 20, through page 64, line 24; and beginning on page 67, line 4, through line 16. Where points of order are waived against only part of a paragraph, a point of order against matter in the balance of the paragraph may be applied only within the balance of the paragraph and not against the entire paragraph. Unless otherwise specified in the report of the Committee on Rules accompanying this resolution, debate on each amendment to title I or title II of the bill, and any amendments thereto, shall be limited to twenty minutes. It shall be in order to consider the amendment printed in the report of the Committee on Rules accompanying this resolution. Each amendment printed in the report may be offered only by the named proponent or a designee, shall be considered as read when offered, shall be debatable for the time specified in the report equally divided and controlled by the proponent and an opponent, shall not be subject to amendment, and shall not be subject to a demand for division of the question in the House or in the Committee of the Whole. All points of order against amendments printed in the report are waived. The amendments specified in the report to be offered by Representative Oberstar of Minnesota or his designee may be considered en bloc. The amendments specified in the report to be offered by Representative Obey of Wisconsin or his designee may be considered en bloc. The chairman of the Committee of the Whole may recognize for the consideration of the amendments printed in part 1 of the report at any time, but not sooner than one hour after the chairman of the Committee on Appropriations announces from the floor a request to the effect. The amendments printed in part 1 of the report shall be considered in the order printed. If both of the amendments numbered 1 and 2 in part 1 of the report are adopted, then only the second to be adopted shall be considered as finally adopted and reported to the House.
