¶29.23 PERMISSION TO FILE REPORT

On motion of Mr. MOAKLEY, by unanimous consent, the Committee on Rules was granted permission until midnight Tuesday, March 23, 1993, to file a report on the bill (H.R. 670) to require the Secretary of Health and Human Services to ensure that pregnant women receiving assistance under title X of the Public Health Service Act are provided with information and counseling regarding their pregnancies, and for other purposes.

¶29.24 PROVIDING FOR THE CONSIDERATION OF H.R. 1335

Mr. DERRICK, by direction of the Committee on Rules, called up the following resolution (H. Res. 132):

Resolved. That upon the adoption of this resolution it shall be in order to consider further in the House the bill (H.R. 1335) making emergency supplemental appropriations for the fiscal year ending September 30, 1993, and for other purposes. All points of order against the bill are waived. It shall be in order to consider one amendment, if offered by the chairman of the Committee on Appropriations. The amendment shall be considered as read, shall be debatable for ten minutes equally divided and controlled by the

proponent and an opponent, shall not be subject to amendment, and shall not be subject to a demand for division of the question. All points of order against the amendment are waived. The previous question shall be considered as ordered on the amendment and on the bill to final passage without intervening motion except one motion to recommit, if offered by Representative Michel of Illinois or his designee. A motion to recommit with instructions shall be debatable for one hour equally divided and controlled by the proponent and an opponent.

29.26 ECONOMIC STIMULUS AND INVESTMENT SUPPLEMENTAL, FY 1993

Mr. NATCHER, pursuant to House Resolution 132, called up the bill (H.R. 1335) making emergency supplemental appropriations for the fiscal year ending September 30, 1993, and for other purposes.

When said bill was considered and read twice.

The bill was ordered to be engrossed and read a third time, was read a third time by title.

Mr. MCDADE moved to recommit the bill to the Committee on Appropriations with instructions to report the bill back to the House forthwith with the following amendment:

Strike everything under Title I with the exception of page 16, lines 13 through 17, "Advances to the Unemployment Trust Fund and Other Funds";

and further to report as promptly as possible a separate bill containing the funding stricken from title I of H.R. 1335 with instructions to bring the spending levels contained in the bill into compliance with the discretionary spending ceilings established by the Budget Enforcement Act of 1990 (Public Law 101-508) so as not to increase the deficit further than the estimated deficit of \$319 billion that is already forecast for this fiscal year.
