By unanimous consent, the title was amended so as to read: "Joint resolution to designate the weeks beginning April 18, 1993, and April 17, 1994, as 'Nancy Moore Thurmond National Organ and Tissue Donor Awareness Week'."

The motion to reconsider the votes whereby said joint resolution was passed and the title was amended was, by unanimous consent, laid on the table.
