Act, approved November 17, 1979 (93 Stat. 866; Public Law 96-122), \$52,070,000."

¶78.32 SUBMISSION OF CONFERENCE REPORT—H.R. 2118

¶78.33 MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT—NATIONAL EMERGENCY WITH RESPECT TO HAITI

The SPEAKER pro tempore, Mr. MCNULTY, laid before the House a message from the President, which was read as follows:

*To the Congress of the United States:*  
Pursuant to section 204(b) of the International Emergency Economic Powers Act (50 U.S.C. 1701 et seq.), the National Emergencies Act (50 U.S.C. 1601 et seq.), section 5 of the United Nations Participation Act of 1945 (22 U.S.C. 287c), and section 301 of title 3 of the United States Code, in view of United Nations Security Council Resolution No. 841 of June 16, 1993, and in order to take additional steps with respect to the actions and policies of the de facto regime in Haiti and the national emergency described and declared in Executive Order No. 12775, I hereby report that I have exercised my statutory authority with respect to Haiti and issued an Executive order that:

—Blocks all property of any Haitian national providing substantial financial or material contributions to the de facto regime in Haiti, or doing substantial business with the de facto regime in Haiti, as identified by the Secretary of the Treasury, that is or comes within the United States or the possession or control of United States persons. The proposed order defines the term "Haitian national" to mean a citizen of Haiti, wherever located; a entity or body organized under the laws of Haiti; and any other person, entity, or body located in Haiti and engaging in the importation, storage, or distribution of products or commodities controlled by sanctions imposed on Haiti pursuant to resolutions adopted either by the United Nations Security Council or the Organization of American States, or otherwise facilitating transactions inconsistent with those sanctions;

—Prohibits the sale or supply, by United States persons, or from the United States, or using U.S.-registered vessels or aircraft, or petroleum or petroleum products or arms and related materiel of all types, including weapons and ammunition, military vehicles and equipment, police equipment and spare parts for the aforementioned, regardless of origin, to any person or entity in Haiti or to any persons or entity for the purpose of any business carried on in or operated
