¶117.6 UNEMPLOYMENT COMPENSATION

The SPEAKER pro tempore, Mr. VOLKMER, pursuant to House Resolution 265 and rule XXIII, declared the House resolved into the Committee of the Whole House on the state of the Union for the consideration of the bill (H.R. 3167) to extend the emergency unemployment compensation program, to establish a system of worker profiling, and for other purposes.

¶117.7 RECORDED VOTE

A recorded vote by electronic device was ordered in the Committee of the Whole on the following amendment submitted by Mrs. JOHNSON of Connecticut:

At the end of section 2 of the bill, insert the following new subsection:

(f) LOW-UNEMPLOYMENT STATES NOT ELIGIBLE FOR EXTENSION.—No emergency unemployment compensation shall be payable in any State by reason of the amendments made by this section unless the average rate of total unemployment in such State for the period consisting of the most recent 3 calendar months for which data are published before the date of the enactment of this Act is 5 percent or greater.
