So, two-thirds of the Members present having voted in favor thereof, the rules were suspended and said bill, as amended, was passed.

On motion of Mr. RAHALL, by unanimous consent, the Committee on Public Works and Transportation was discharged from further consideration of the bill of the Senate (S. 412) to amend title 4, United States Code, regarding the collection of certain payments for shipments via motor common carriers of property and nonhousehold goods freight forwarders, and for other purposes.

When said bill was considered and read twice.

Mr. RAHALL submitted the following amendment, which was agreed to:

Strike out all after the enacting clause and insert the provisions of H.R. 2121 as passed by the House.

The bill, as amended, was ordered to be read a third time, was read a third time by title, and passed.

By unanimous consent, the title was amended so as to read: "An Act to amend title 49, United States Code, re-

lating to procedures for resolving claims involving unfiled, negotiated transportation rates, and for other purposes."

A motion to reconsider the votes whereby said bill, as amended, was passed and the title was amended was, by unanimous consent, laid on the table.

Ordered, That the Clerk request the concurrence of the Senate in said amendments.

By unanimous consent, H.R. 2121, a similar House bill, was laid on the table.
