¶138.35 HIGHER EDUCATION AMENDMENTS

On motion of Mr. FORD of Michigan, by unanimous consent, the bill of the Senate (S. 1507) to make technical amendments to the Higher Education Amendments of 1992 and the Higher Education Act of 1965, and for other purposes; together with the following amendment of the Senate to the amendments of the House thereto, was taken from the Speaker's table:

In lieu of the matter proposed to be inserted by the House amendment to the text of the bill, insert:

SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE; REFERENCES.

(a) SHORT TITLE.—This Act may be cited as the "Higher Education Technical Amendments of 1993".

(b) REFERENCES.—References in this Act to "the Act" are references to the Higher Education Act of 1965.

SEC. 2. TECHNICAL AMENDMENTS.

(a) AMENDMENTS TO TITLES I, II, AND III OF THE ACT.—Titles I, II, and III of the Act (20 U.S.C. 1001 et seq., 1021 et seq., 1051 et seq.) are amended—
