All points of order against the amendments printed in the report are waived. If more than one of the amendments printed in part 2 of the report is adopted, only the last to be adopted shall be considered as finally adopted and reported to the House. At the conclusion of consideration of the joint resolution for amendment the Committee shall rise and report the joint resolution to the House with such amendment as may have been finally adopted. The previous question shall be considered as ordered on the joint resolution and any amendment thereto to final passage without intervening motion except one motion to recommit with or without instructions.

When said resolution was considered.

On motion of Mr. HALL of Ohio, the previous question was ordered on the resolution to its adoption or rejection.

The question being put, viva voce,

Will the House agree to said resolution?

The SPEAKER pro tempore, Mrs. MINK, announced that the yeas had it.
