The following amendment, reported from the Committee of the Whole House on the state of the Union, was agreed to:

Strike out all after the enacting clause and insert:

SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

This Act may be cited as the—  
(1) "Consolidated and Reformed Education, Employment, and Rehabilitation Systems Act"; or  
(2) "CAREERS Act".

SEC. 2. TABLE OF CONTENTS.
