

(1) IN GENERAL.—Subtitle A of title VII of the Stewart B. McKinney Homeless Assistance Act (42 U.S.C. 11421 et seq.) is repealed.

(2) TABLE OF CONTENTS.—The table of contents of such Act is amended by striking the items relating to subtitle A of title VII of such Act.

(b) SUBTITLE C.—

(1) IN GENERAL.—Subtitle C of title VII of the Stewart B. McKinney Homeless Assistance Act (42 U.S.C. 11441 et seq.), except section 738, is hereby repealed.

(2) TABLE OF CONTENTS.—The table of contents of such Act is amended—

(A) by striking the item relating to subtitle C of title VII of such Act; and

(B) by striking the items relating to sections 731 through 737 and sections 739 through 741.

SEC. 713. EFFECTIVE DATE.

The repeals and amendments made by this Act shall take effect on July 1, 1997, except for amendments to the Rehabilitation Act of 1973.

¶117.23 RE-REFERRAL—H.R. 2202

On motion of Mr. MCKEON, by unanimous consent, the bill (H.R. 2202) to amend the Immigration and Nationality Act to improve deterrence of illegal immigration to the United States by increasing border patrol and investigative personnel, by increasing penalties for alien smuggling and for document fraud, by reforming exclusion and deportation law and procedures, by improving the verification system for eligibility for employment, and through other measures, to reform the legal immigration system and facilitate legal entries into the United States, and for other purposes; which had been referred to the Committee on the Judiciary, the Committee on Banking and Financial Services, the Committee on Government Reform and Oversight, the Committee on National Security, and the Committee on Ways and Means; be re-referred to the Committee on the Judiciary, the Committee on Banking and Financial Services, the Committee on Government Reform and Oversight, the Committee on National Security, and the Committee on Ways and Means, the Committee on Agriculture and the Committee on Economic and Educational Opportunities for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned.

¶117.24 WAIVING POINTS OF ORDER AGAINST CONFERENCE REPORT ON H.R. 1817
