¶147.4 MESSAGE FROM THE SENATE

¶147.5 FOREIGN OPERATIONS APPROPRIATIONS, FY 1996

On motion of Mr. CALLAHAN, the bill (H.R. 1868) making appropriations for foreign operations, export financing, and related programs for the fiscal year ending September 30, 1996, and for other purposes; together with the following amendment of the Senate to the House amendment to the Senate amendment numbered 115, was taken from the Speaker's table:

In lieu of the matter proposed to be inserted by the House amendment to the Senate amendment, insert: "Provided, That in determining eligibility for assistance from funds appropriated to carry out section 104 of the Foreign Assistance Act of 1961, non-governmental and multilateral organizations shall not be subjected to requirements more restrictive than the requirements applicable to foreign governments for such assistance: *Provided further*, That none of the funds made available under this Act may be used to lobby for or against abortion".

¶147.7 WAIVING POINTS OF ORDER AGAINST THE CONFERENCE REPORT ON H.R. 2020

All points of order against the conference report and against its consideration are waived. If the conference report is adopted, then a motion that the House insist on its disagreement to the amendment of the Senate numbered 132 shall be considered as adopted.
