41.9 COMMUNITY HOUSING OPPORTUNITY AND RESPONSIBILITY

The SPEAKER pro tempore, Mr. LATOURETTE, pursuant to House Resolution 133 and rule XXIII, declared the House resolved into the Committee of the Whole House on the state of the Union for the further consideration of the bill (H.R. 2) to repeal the United States Housing Act of 1937, deregulate the public housing program and the program for rental housing assistance for low-income families, and increase community control over such programs, and for other purposes.

A recorded vote by electronic device was ordered in the Committee of the Whole on the following amendment submitted by Mr. JACKSON:

Page 25, line 25, strike the second comma and all that follows through the comma in line 3 on page 26.

Page 27, after line 10, insert the following:

(4) RIGHTS OF OCCUPANCY.—This subsection may not be construed (nor may any provision of subsection (d) or (e)) to create a right on the part of any public housing agency to evict or terminate assistance for a family solely on the basis of any failure of the family to comply with the community work requirement under paragraph (1).

Page 33, line 14, before the comma insert "(except to the extent that this section specifically limits any authority to evict or terminate assistance)".
