(b) EXCEPTIONS.—The limitation contained in subsection (a) shall not apply with respect to—

(1) the deployment of United States Armed Forces for the express purpose of ensuring the safe withdrawal of such Armed Forces from the Republic of Bosnia and Herzegovina;

(2) a limited number of members of United States Armed Forces sufficient only to protect United States diplomatic facilities and citizens; or

(3) noncombatant personnel to advise the North Atlantic Treaty Organization (NATO) Commander in the Republic of Bosnia and Herzegovina.

Mr. MINGE submitted the privileged motion to instruct the managers on the part of the House at the conference with the Senate on the disagreeing votes of the two Houses on the bill (H.R. 2400) to authorize funds for Federal-aid highways, highway safety programs, and transit programs, and for other purposes, to ensure that spending for highways and transit programs authorized in the conference agreement on the bill (H.R. 2400) is fully paid for using estimates of the Congressional Budget Office, to reject the use of estimates from any other source, to reject any method of budgeting that departs from the budget enforcement principles currently in effect, or the use of the budget surplus to pay for spending on highways or transit programs.
