79.28 U.S. CAPITOL POLICE MEMORIAL FUND

On motion of Mr. THOMAS, by unanimous consent, the Committees on House Oversight and Ways and Means were discharged from further consideration of the bill (H.R. 4354) to establish the United States Capitol Police Memorial Fund on behalf of the families of Detective John Michael Gibson and Private First Class Jacob Joseph Chestnut of the United States Capitol Police.

When said bill was considered, read twice.

Mr. THOMAS submitted the following amendment which was agreed to:

Add at the end of section 4 the following: "Under such regulations, and using amounts in the Fund, a financial adviser or trustee, as appropriate, for the families of Detective John Michael Gibson and Private First Class Jacob Joseph Chestnut of the United States Capitol Police shall be appointed to advise the families respecting disbursement to them of amounts in the Fund."

The bill, as amended, was ordered to be engrossed and read a third time, was read a third time by title, and passed.

A motion to reconsider the votes whereby the bill was passed was, by unanimous consent, laid on the table.

Ordered, That the Clerk request the concurrence of the Senate in said bill.

79.29 EMPLOYMENT TRAINING AND LITERACY ENHANCEMENT
