CONFEREES—H.R. 4276

Mr. MOLLOHAN moved that the managers on the part of the House at the conference on the disagreeing votes of the two Houses on H.R. 4276 be instructed to not concur in any Senate legislative provisions or any extraneous legislative provisions, which are outside the scope of conference, which could have the effect of causing a Government shutdown.

¶103.16 WAIVING REQUIREMENT OF  
CLAUSE 4(B) OF RULE XI

Mrs. MYRICK, by direction of the Committee on Rules, called up the following resolution (H. Res. 575):

Resolved, That the requirement of clause 4(b) of rule XI for a two-thirds vote to consider a report from the Committee on Rules on the same day it is presented to the House is waived with respect to any resolution reported from that committee before the legislative day of October 11, 1998, providing for consideration or disposition of any of the following:

(1) A bill or joint resolution making general appropriations for the fiscal year ending September 30, 1999, any amendment thereto, any conference report thereon, or any amendment reported in disagreement from a conference thereon.

(2) A bill or joint resolution that includes provisions making continuing appropriations for fiscal year 1999, any amendment thereto, any conference report thereon, or any amendment reported in disagreement from a conference thereon.

SEC. 2. It shall be in order at any time before October 11, 1998, for the Speaker to entertain motions to suspend the rules, provided that the object of any such motion is announced from the floor at least two hours
