¶28.14 U.S. ARMED FORCES—FEDERAL  
REPUBLIC OF YUGOSLAVIA

Mr. SPENCE, by unanimous consent, submitted the following resolution (H. Res. 130):

Whereas the President has authorized United States participation in NATO military operations against the Federal Republic of Yugoslavia;

Whereas up to 22,000 members of the Armed Forces are presently involved in operations in and around the Balkans region with the active participation of NATO and other coalition forces; and

Whereas the House of Representatives and the American people have the greatest pride in the members of the Armed Forces and strongly support them: Now, therefore, be it Resolved, That the House of Representatives supports the members of the United States Armed Forces who are engaged in military operations against the Federal Republic of Yugoslavia and recognizes their professionalism, dedication, patriotism, and courage.

Pending consideration of said resolution.

On motion of Mr. SPENCE, by unanimous consent,

Ordered, That the previous question be ordered on the resolution to its adoption without intervening motion except for one hour of debate, equally divided and controlled by the chairman and ranking member of the Committee on International Relations and the chairman and ranking member of the Committee on Armed Services or their designees.
