¶74.13 DEFENSE AUTHORIZATION

On motion of Mr. SPENCE, by direction of the Committee on Armed Services and pursuant to clause 1 of rule XXII, the bill of the Senate (S. 1059) to authorize appropriations for fiscal year 2000 for military activities of the Department of Defense, for military construction, and for defense activities of the Department of Energy, to prescribe personnel strengths for such fiscal year for the Armed Forces, and for other purposes; together with the amendment of the House thereto, was taken from the Speaker's table.

When on motion of Mr. SPENCE, it was,

Resolved, That the House insist upon its amendment and agree to the conference asked by the Senate on the disagreeing votes of the two Houses thereon.

¶74.14 MOTION TO INSTRUCT CONFEREES—S. 1059

Mr. SKELTON moved that the managers on the part of the House at the conference on the disagreeing votes of the two Houses on S. 1059 be instructed to insist upon the provisions contained in section 1207 of the House amendment (relating to goals for the conflict with Yugoslavia), in order to recognize the achievement of goals stated therein by (1) the United States Armed Forces who participated in Operation Allied Force and served and succeeded in the highest traditions of the Armed Forces of the United States; (2) the families of American service men and women participating in Operation Allied Force, who have bravely borne the burden of separation from their loved ones, and staunchly supported them during the conflict; (3) President Clinton, Commander in Chief of United States Armed Forces, for his leadership during Operation Allied Force; (4) Secretary of Defense, William Cohen, Chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff, General Henry Shelton and Supreme Allied Commander-Europe, General Wesley Clark, for their planning and implementation of Operation Allied Force; (5) Secretary of State, Madeleine Albright, National Security Advisor, Sandy Berger, and other Administration officials who engaged in diplomatic efforts to resolve the Kosovo conflict; (6) all of the forces from our NATO allies, who served with distinction and success; and (7) the front line
