Page 94, after line 3, insert the following new section:

SEC. 424. The amounts otherwise provided by this Act are revised by increasing the amount made available for "DEPARTMENT OF VETERANS AFFAIRS—Departmental Administration—Grants for Construction of State Extended Care Facilities", by reducing the amount made available for "INDEPENDENT AGENCIES—Chemical Safety and Hazard Investigation Board—Salaries and Expenses", and by reducing the amount made available for "INDEPENDENT AGENCIES—Environmental Protection Agency—Office of Inspector General", by \$7,000,000, \$2,000,000, and \$5,000,000, respectively.

When Mr. LATOURETTE, Chairman, pursuant to House Resolution 275, reported the bill back to the House with sundry amendments adopted by the Committee.

The previous question having been ordered by said resolution.

The following amendments, reported from the Committee of the Whole House on the state of the Union, were agreed to:

Page 93, line 6: strike the period and insert the following: "subject to enactment of legislation authorizing funds for such purpose."

Page 94, after line 3, insert the following new section:

SEC. 424. The amounts otherwise provided by this Act are revised by increasing the amount made available for "DEPARTMENT OF VETERANS AFFAIRS—Departmental Administration—Grants for Construction of State Extended Care Facilities", by reducing the amount made available for "INDEPENDENT AGENCIES—Chemical Safety and Hazard Investigation Board—Salaries and Expenses", and by reducing the amount made available for "INDEPENDENT AGENCIES—Environmental Protection Agency—Office of Inspector General", by \$7,000,000, \$2,000,000, and \$5,000,000, respectively.

At the end of the bill (before the short title), insert the following new section:

SEC. . It is the sense of congress that, along with health care, housing, education, and other benefits, the presence of an honor guard at a veteran's funeral is a benefit that a veteran has earned, and, therefore, the executive branch should provide funeral honor details for the funerals of veterans when requested, in accordance with law.

At the end of the bill (before the short title), insert the following new section:

RURAL VETERANS HEALTH CARE SERVICES

SEC. . The House supports efforts to implement improvements in health care services for veterans in rural areas.

The bill, as amended, was ordered to be engrossed and read a third time, was read a third time by title.

Mr. OBEY moved to recommit the bill to the Committee on Appropriations with instructions to report the bill back to the House promptly in a form that ensures compliance with the section 302(b) allocation using Congressional Budget Office scorekeeping conventions to avoid sequestration of billions of dollars in discretionary spending in vital Federal programs including the national defense, the National Institutes of Health, veterans medical care, and education and environmental programs, among many others.
