## ¶95.44 ADDITIONAL COSPONSORS—H.R. 88

Mr. HOLT, by unanimous consent, was authorized to be considered as the first sponsor of the bill (H.R. 88) to amend the Treasury and General Government Appropriations Act, 1999, to repeal the requirement regarding data produced under Federal grants and agreements awarded to institutions of higher education, hospitals, and other nonprofit organizations (a bill originally introduced by the late Representative Brown of California); for the purposes of adding cosponsors and requesting reprintings pursuant to clause 7 of rule XXII.

## ¶95.49 BILL PRESENTED TO THE PRESIDENT

H.R. 457. To amend title 5, United States Code, to increase the amount of leave time available to a Federal employee in any year in connection with servicing as an organ donor, and for other purposes.
