

**CONGRESSIONAL GOLD MEDAL PRESENTATION
CEREMONY FOR REVEREND AND MRS. BILLY
GRAHAM—CAPITOL ROTUNDA AUTHORIZATION**

Mar. 13, 1996
[S. Con. Res. 45]

Resolved by the Senate (the House of Representatives concurring), That the rotunda of the United States Capitol is hereby authorized to be used on May 2, 1996, at 2 o'clock post meridian for the presentation of the Congressional Gold Medal to Reverend and Mrs. Billy Graham. Physical preparations for the conduct of the ceremony shall be carried out in accordance with such conditions as may be prescribed by the Architect of the Capitol.

**SPECIAL OLYMPICS TORCH RELAY—CAPITOL
GROUNDS AUTHORIZATION**

Authorizing the 1996 Special Olympics Torch Relay to be run through the Capitol Grounds.

Resolved by the House of Representatives (the Senate concurring),

**SECTION 1. AUTHORIZATION OF RUNNING OF SPECIAL OLYMPICS
TORCH RELAY THROUGH CAPITOL GROUNDS.**

On May 24, 1996, or on such other date as the Speaker of the House of Representatives and the President pro tempore of the Senate may jointly designate, the 1996 Special Olympics Torch Relay may be run through the Capitol Grounds, as part of the journey of the Special Olympics torch to the District of Columbia Special Olympics summer games at Gallaudet University in the District of Columbia.

SEC. 2. RESPONSIBILITY OF CAPITOL POLICE BOARD.

The Capitol Police Board shall take such actions as may be necessary to carry out section 1.

SEC. 3. CONDITIONS RELATING TO PHYSICAL PREPARATIONS.

The Architect of the Capitol may prescribe conditions for physical preparations for the event authorized by section 1.
