## CHAPTER 503

June 28, 1952

## AN ACT

For the relief of Philip Fugh, Sarah Liu Fugh, and John Fugh.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,* That, in the administration of the immigration laws, Philip Fugh, his wife, Sarah Liu Fugh, and son, John Fugh, shall be considered as having been lawfully admitted for permanent residence as of the date of the enactment of this Act, on payment of the required visa fees and head taxes.

SEC. 2. Upon the granting of permanent residence to such aliens as provided for in this Act, the Secretary of State shall instruct the proper quota-control officer to deduct three numbers from the appropriate quota for the first year that such quota is available.

## CHAPTER 504

June 28, 1952

## AN ACT

For the relief of Leszek Kazimierz Pawlowicz.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,* That, for the purposes of the immigration and naturalization laws, Leszek Kazimierz Pawlowicz shall be held and considered to have been lawfully admitted to the United States for permanent residence as of the date of the enactment of this Act, upon payment of the required visa fee and head tax. Upon the granting of permanent residence to such alien as provided for in this Act, the Secretary of State shall instruct the proper quota-control officer to deduct one number from the number of displaced persons who shall be granted the status of permanent residence pursuant to section 4 of the Displaced Persons Act, as amended (62 Stat. 1011; 64 Stat. 219; 50 U. S. C. App. 1953).

For the relief of Sebastiano Belló, Dino Bianchi, Pierino Ciccarese, Vincenzo Dall'Alda, Vittorio De Gasperi, Salvatore Puggioni, Giovanni Battista Volpato, and Leone Montini.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,* That, for the purposes of the immigration and naturalization laws, Sebastiano Belló, Dino Bianchi, Pierino Ciccarese, Vincenzo Dall'Alda, Vittorio De Gasperi, Salvatore Puggioni, Giovanni Battista Volpato, and Leone Montini, Brothers of the Sons of the Sacred Heart, shall be held and considered to have been lawfully admitted to the United States for permanent residence as of the date of the enactment of this Act, upon payment of the required visa fees and head taxes. Upon the granting of permanent residence to such aliens as provided for in this Act, the Secretary of State shall instruct the proper quota-control officer to deduct eight numbers from the appropriate quota for the first year that such quota is available.
