## CHAPTER 661

## AN ACT

For the relief of Morris Tutnauer.

July 10, 1952  
[H. R. 3527]

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,* That the Secretary of the Treasury be, and he is hereby, authorized and directed to pay, out of any money in the Treasury not otherwise appropriated, to Morris Tutnauer, of New York City, New York, the sum of \$7,500, in full settlement of all claims against the United States by said Morris Tutnauer on account of the injuries sustained by him when an automobile being operated by him was struck by a War Department automobile on July 22, 1943, in Queens County, New York City, New York, said War Department automobile being operated by a private of the United States Army: *Provided*, That no part of the amount appropriated in this Act in excess of 10 per centum thereof shall be paid or delivered to or received by any agent or attorney on account of services rendered in connection with this claim, and the same shall be unlawful, any contract to the contrary notwithstanding. Any person violating the provisions of this Act shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof shall be fined in any sum not exceeding \$1,000.

## CHAPTER 662

## AN ACT

For the relief of the estate of Michael R. Marsiglia.

July 10, 1952  
[H. R. 3653]

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,* That the Secretary of the Treasury be, and he is hereby, authorized and directed to pay, out of any money in the Treasury not otherwise appropriated, \$11,288.50 to the estate of Michael R. Marsiglia. The payment of such sum shall be in full settlement of all claims of said estate against the United States as damages for the death of said Michael R. Marsiglia, who was fatally injured on December 2, 1944, when he was struck by a United States Army vehicle while said motor vehicle was proceeding on and over the public highway at the corner of West Houston and Varick Streets, Manhattan, New York City, New York: *Provided*, That no part of the amount appropriated in this Act in excess of 10 per centum thereof shall be paid or delivered to or received by any agent or attorney on account of services rendered in connection with this claim, and the same shall be unlawful, any contract to the contrary notwithstanding. Any person violating the provisions of this Act shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof shall be fined in any sum not exceeding \$1,000.
