## AN ACT

For the relief of Mrs. Aiko Eijima Phillips.

April 18, 1952  
[H.R. 2634]

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,* That, notwithstanding the provisions of section 13 (c) of the Immigration Act of 1924, as amended, Mrs. Aiko Eijima Phillips, the Japanese wife of Roscoe H. Phillips, a United States citizen, may be admitted to the United States for permanent residence, if she is found to be otherwise admissible under the provisions of the immigration laws.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,* That, for the purposes of sections 4 (a) and 9 of the Immigration Act of 1924, as amended, the minor child, Erika Bammes (Patricia Ann Cox), shall be held and considered to be the natural-born alien child of Master Sergeant Clayton T. and Mrs. Martha N. Cox, citizens of the United States.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,* That, notwithstanding the provisions of section 13 (c) of the Immigration Act of 1924, as amended, Nagakubo (also known as Roy Mervin Nelson), the minor child of Roy M. Nelson, a United States citizen, may be admitted to the United States for permanent residence if he is found to be otherwise admissible under the provisions of the immigration laws.
