For the relief of Midori Sugimoto.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, That, for the purposes of sections 4 (a) and 9 of the Immigration Act of 1924, as amended, and notwithstanding the provisions of section 13 (c) of that Act, the minor child, Midori Sugimoto, shall be held and considered to be the natural-born alien child of Lieutenant and Mrs. Thomas H. Malin, citizens of the United States.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, That, for the purposes of sections 4 (a) and 9 of the Immigration Act of 1924, as amended, the minor child, Debra Elaine Evans, shall be held and considered to be the natural-born alien child of Technical Sergeant and Mrs. Charles E. Evans, citizens of the United States.

CHAPTER 396

AN ACT

For the relief of Ivo Cerne.

Quota deduction.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, That, for the purposes of the immigration and naturalization laws, Ivo Cerne shall be held and considered to have been lawfully admitted to the United States for permanent residence as of the date of the enactment of this Act, upon payment of the required visa fee and head tax. Upon the granting of permanent residence to such alien as provided for in this Act, the Secretary of State shall instruct the proper quota-control officer to deduct one number from the number of displaced persons who shall be granted the status of permanent residence pursuant to section 4 of the Displaced Persons Act, as amended (62 Stat. 1011; 50 U. S. C. App. 1953).
