In the event that the marriage between the above persons shall occur within three months after the entry of the said Anni Wolf and her minor son, the Attorney General is authorized and directed to record the lawful admission for permanent residence of the said Anni Wolf and her minor son as of the date of the payment by them of the required visa fees.

Upon the granting of permanent residence to such alien as provided for in this Act, the Secretary of State shall instruct the proper quota-control officer to deduct one number from the appropriate quota for the first year that such quota is available.
