AN ACT

For the relief of Edeltraud Kamberg Douglass.

August 23, 1954
[H. R. 5639]

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, That, notwithstanding the provision of section 212 (a) (9) of the Immigration and Nationality Act, Edeltraud Kamberg Douglass may be admitted to the United States for permanent residence if she is found to be otherwise admissible under the provisions of that Act: *Provided,* That this exemption shall apply only to a ground of exclusion of which the Department of State or the Department of Justice have knowledge prior to the enactment of this Act.

CHAPTER 882

AN ACT

For the relief of Mrs. Caridad Rosa Avila Leyva de Ernest.

August 23, 1954
[H. R. 5816]

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, That, notwithstanding the provision of section 212 (a) (12) of the Immigration and Nationality Act, Mrs. Caridad Rosa Avila Leyva de Ernest may be admitted to the United States for permanent residence if she is found to be otherwise admissible under the provisions of that Act: *Provided,* That this exemption shall apply only to a ground for exclusion of which the Department of State or Department of Justice have knowledge prior to the enactment of this Act.

CHAPTER 883

AN ACT

For the relief of Evanthia Demetrios Makrozonari.

August 23, 1954
[H. R. 5822]

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, That, for the purposes of sections 101 (a) (27) (A) and 205 of the Immigration and Nationality Act, the minor child, Evanthia Demetrios Makrozonari, shall be held and considered to be the natural-born alien child of Mrs. Evanthia G. Makris, a citizen of the United States.

CHAPTER 884

AN ACT

For the relief of Alberto Ugo Landry.

August 23, 1954
[H. R. 5944]

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, That, for the purposes of the Immigration and Nationality Act, Alberto Ugo Landry shall be held and considered to have been lawfully admitted to the United States for permanent residence as of the date of the enactment of this Act, upon payment of the required visa fee. Upon the grant-

ing of permanent residence to such alien as provided for in this Act, the Secretary of State shall instruct the proper quota-control officer to deduct one number from the appropriate quota for the first year that such quota is available.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, That, for the purposes of section 5 (a) of the Refugee Relief Act of 1953, Roger Feghali shall be held and considered to be under ten years of age.

For the relief of Tibor, Szuzsa (Susanne), and Judith Sauer.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, That, for the purposes of the Immigration and Nationality Act, Tibor, Szuzsa (Susanne), and Judith Sauer shall be held and considered to have been lawfully admitted to the United States for permanent residence as of the date of the enactment of this Act upon payment of the required visa fees. Upon the granting of permanent residence to such aliens as provided for in this Act, the Secretary of State shall instruct the proper quota-control officer to deduct three numbers from the appropriate quota for the first year that such quota is available.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, That, notwithstanding the provision of section 212 (a) (9) of the Immigration and Nationality Act, Liborio Guido Rutilio may be admitted to the United States for permanent residence if he is found to be otherwise admissible under the provisions of that Act: *Provided,* That this exemption shall apply only to a ground for exclusion of which the Department of State or the Department of Justice have knowledge prior to the enactment of this Act.
