

SEC. 2. The Secretary of the Treasury is hereby authorized and directed to pay, out of any money in the Treasury not otherwise appropriated, to the said Tennessee C. Batts, an amount equal to the aggregate of the amounts paid by him or withheld from the sums due him in the complete or partial satisfaction of the claim of the United States for such refund: *Provided*, That no part of the amount appropriated in this Act shall be paid or delivered to or received by any agent or attorney on account of services rendered in connection with this claim, and the same shall be unlawful, any contract to the contrary notwithstanding. Any person violating the provisions of this Act shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof shall be fined in any sum not exceeding \$1,000.

CHAPTER 355

AN ACT

For the relief of Mrs. Lee Tai Hung Quan and Quan Ah Sang.

July 12, 1955
[H. R. 3070]

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, That, for the purposes of the Immigration and Nationality Act, Mrs. Lee Tai Hung Quan and Quan Ah Sang, wife and minor child of Lloyd Quan, deceased citizen of the United States and World War II veteran, shall be held and considered to be nonquota immigrants.

CHAPTER 356

AN ACT

For the relief of Virgil Won (also known as Virgilio Jackson).

July 12, 1955
[H. R. 3075]

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, That, in the administration of the Immigration and Nationality Act, section 202 (b) shall be held not to apply to the case of Virgil Won (also known as Virgilio Jackson), who was born in Nicaragua.

CHAPTER 357

AN ACT

To authorize the issuance of a land patent to certain lands situate in the city and county of Honolulu, Island of Oahu, to The Protestant Episcopal Church in the Hawaiian Islands.

July 12, 1955
[H. R. 3636]

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, That the Commissioner of Public Lands of the Territory of Hawaii, with the consent of the Governor of said Territory, be authorized to issue a land patent to The Protestant Episcopal Church in the Hawaiian Islands, a religious corporation, covering the following described land: Lot numbered 186, of the Waimanalo Beach lots, containing an area of approxi-
