

Homer L. Willess, \$2,552.50; Raymond E. Wiseman, \$2,888.65; Edward T. S. Wong, \$477; Chester W. Yasuda, \$41.35: *Provided*, That no part of the amount appropriated in this Act shall be paid or delivered to or received by any agent or attorney on account of services rendered in connection with this claim, and the same shall be unlawful, any contract to the contrary notwithstanding. Any person violating the provisions of this Act shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof shall be fined in any sum not exceeding \$1,000.

SEC. 2. This Act shall become effective immediately upon its enactment.

AN ACT

For the relief of Hsiao-li Lindsay (nee Li-Hsiao-li).

April 9, 1960
[H. R. 9444]

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, That, for the purposes of the Immigration and Nationality Act, Hsiao-li Lindsay (nee Li-Hsiao-li), shall be deemed to have been born in Great Britain and the provisions of sections 201(a), 202(a)(5), and 202(b)(2) of that Act shall not be applicable in this case.

AN ACT

For the relief of Patricia Crouse Bredee.

April 14, 1960
[S. 231]

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, That, in the administration of the immigration and nationality laws, Patricia Crouse Bredee shall be held and considered to have resided in and to have been physically present in the United States for a period of five years after she had attained the age of sixteen years.

AN ACT

For the relief of Hoo W. Yuey and his dependent children.

April 14, 1960
[H. R. 2310]

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, That the Comptroller General of the United States is hereby authorized and directed, notwithstanding the provisions of an Act providing for the barring of claims against the United States (54 Stat. 1061), to accept and consider any claim filed on his own behalf by Hoo W. Yuey for the return of \$704 which was deducted from his Army pay as his contribution to a family allowance payable to his dependents

but which was not in fact paid to such dependents and also any claim filed on behalf of his dependent children for the portions of the family allowance contributed by the Government which would have been payable on their behalf but which was not in fact paid, such claim or claims to be filed within one year after the enactment of this Act.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, That the Attorney General is authorized and directed to cancel any outstanding orders and warrants of deportation, warrants of arrest, and bond, which may have issued in the case of Lionie Tarpinian. From and after the date of the enactment of this Act, the said Lionie Tarpinian shall not again be subject to deportation by reason of the same facts upon which such deportation proceedings were commenced or any such warrants and orders have issued.

For the relief of Sirvart Kasabian.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, That the Attorney General is authorized and directed to cancel any outstanding orders and warrants of deportation, warrants of arrest, and bond, which may have issued in the case of Sirvart Kasabian. From and after the date of the enactment of this Act, the said Sirvart Kasabian shall not again be subject to deportation by reason of the same facts upon which such deportation proceedings were commenced or any such warrants and orders have issued.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, That Grace C. Ream of Washington, District of Columbia, an employee of the Department of the Air Force, is hereby relieved of all liability for repayment to the United States of the sum of \$651.96, representing overpayment
