

## Private Law 89-173

## AN ACT

For the relief of Maxie L. Rupert.

October 30, 1965  
[H. R. 2578]

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, That Maxie L. Rupert of Battle Creek, Michigan, is hereby relieved of liability to the United States in the amount of \$1,344, the amount of overpayments of salary between December 10, 1962, and June 23, 1963, resulting from a promotion in violation of section 1310(c) of the Act of November 1, 1951 (5 U.S.C. 43 note). In the audit and settlement of the accounts of any certifying or disbursing officer of the United States, credit shall be given for any amount for which liability is relieved by this Act.*

SEC. 2. The Secretary of the Treasury is hereby authorized and directed to pay, out of any money in the Treasury not otherwise appropriated, to Maxie L. Rupert, an amount equal to the aggregate of the amounts paid by him, or withheld from sums otherwise due him, in complete or partial satisfaction of the liability to the United States specified in the first section. No part of the amount appropriated in this Act shall be paid or delivered to or received by any agent or attorney on account of services rendered in connection with this claim, and the same shall be unlawful, any contract to the contrary notwithstanding. Any person violating the provisions of this Act shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof shall be fined in any sum not exceeding \$1,000.

## AN ACT

To provide for the free entry of a mass spectrometer for the use of Saint Louis University.

October 30, 1965  
[H. R. 4832]

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, That (a) the Secretary of the Treasury is authorized and directed to admit free of duty one mass spectrometer (including all accompanying equipment, parts, accessories, and appurtenances) for the use of Saint Louis University, Saint Louis, Missouri.*

(b) If the liquidation of the entry of any article described in subsection (a) has become final, such entry shall be reliquidated and the appropriate refund of duty shall be made.

## AN ACT

To provide for the free entry of an isotope separator for the use of Princeton University, Princeton, New Jersey.

October 30, 1965  
[H. R. 8272]

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, That (a) the Secretary of the Treasury is authorized and directed to admit free of duty*

Princeton University.

the isotope separator (and its accompanying equipment, parts, accessories, and appurtenances) imported for the use of Princeton University, Princeton, New Jersey, during June 1964.

(b) If the liquidation of the entry of the articles described in subsection (a) has become final, such entry shall be reliquidated and the appropriate refund of duty shall be made.

AN ACT

For the relief of Rifkin Textiles Corporation.

October 30, 1965  
[H. R. 8646]

Rifkin Textiles Corp.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, That (a) notwithstanding the time limitation prescribed by section 520 of the Tariff Act of 1930 (19 U.S.C. 1520) or any other statute of limitation, the consumption entries made on behalf of Rifkin Textiles Corporation of New York, New York, and set out in subsection (b), may be reliquidated in accordance with the law applicable as of the date such entries were made and refund of duties may be made in accordance with such reliquidation if application for such reliquidation is made within one year after the date of enactment of this Act.

(b) The consumption entries referred to in subsection (a) and the date on which each such entry was liquidated are as follows:

AN ACT

To provide for the free entry of an electrically driven rotating chair for the use of the Louisiana State University Medical Center, New Orleans, Louisiana.

October 30, 1965  
[H. R. 9588]

Louisiana State University Medical Center.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, That the Secretary of the Treasury is authorized and directed to admit free of duty one electrically driven rotating chair (and the control unit and other equipment accompanying such chair) for the use of the Louisiana State University Medical Center, New Orleans, Louisiana.

SEC. 2. If the liquidation of the entry of any article described in the first section of this Act has become final, such entry shall be reliquidated and the appropriate refund of duty shall be made.
