AN ACT

For the relief of Nermin Demirbag Lavapies.

November 2, 1966
[H. R. 13192]

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, That, for the purposes of the Immigration and Nationality Act, Nermin Demirbag Lavapies shall be held and considered to have been lawfully admitted to the United States for permanent residence as of June 26, 1957.

AN ACT

For the relief of Donald E. Auseon.

November 2, 1966
[H. R. 13682]

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, That Donald E. Auseon, of Canton, Ohio, is hereby relieved of liability to the United States in the amount of \$831.46 representing an overpayment between April 12, 1965, and August 27, 1965, for overtime and night differential pay paid to him by the United States Post Office Department through administrative error. In the audit and settlement of the accounts of any certifying or disbursing officer of the United States, credit shall be given for amounts for which liability is relieved by this Act.

SEC. 2. The Secretary of the Treasury is authorized and directed to pay, out of any money in the Treasury not otherwise appropriated, to Donald E. Auseon an amount equal to the aggregate of the amounts paid by him, or withheld from sums otherwise due him, in complete or partial satisfaction of the liability to the United States specified in the first section.

SEC. 3. No part of the amount appropriated in this Act shall be paid or delivered to or received by any agent or attorney on account of services rendered in connection with this claim, and the same shall be unlawful, any contract to the contrary notwithstanding. Any person violating the provisions of this Act shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof shall be fined in any sum not exceeding \$1,000.

AN ACT

For the relief of Robert A. Ivins.

November 2, 1966
[H. R. 13683]

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, That Robert A. Ivins, of Canton, Ohio, is hereby relieved of liability to the United States in the amount of \$1,192.98, representing an overpayment between March 29, 1965, and August 27, 1965, for overtime and night differential pay paid to him by the United States Post Office Department through administrative error. In the audit and settlement of the

accounts of any certifying or disbursing officer of the United States, credit shall be given for amounts for which liability is relieved by this Act.

SEC. 2. The Secretary of the Treasury is authorized and directed to pay, out of any money in the Treasury not otherwise appropriated, to Robert A. Ivins an amount equal to the aggregate of the amounts paid by him, or withheld from sums otherwise due him, in complete or partial satisfaction of the liability to the United States specified in the first section.

SEC. 3. No part of the amount appropriated in this Act shall be paid or delivered to or received by any agent or attorney on account of services rendered in connection with this claim, and the same shall be unlawful, any contract to the contrary notwithstanding. Any person violating the provisions of this Act shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof shall be fined in any sum not exceeding \$1,000.

For the relief of Specialist Fifth Class Ronald J. Olson, United States Army, retired.

Sp5c. Ronald J.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, That Specialist Fifth Class Ronald J. Olson, United States Army, retired (RA55676271), is relieved of liability to pay to the United States the sum of \$170, representing the balance due on the total amount which, by reason of administrative error, the Department of the Army failed to deduct from his pay for the months of December 1964, and January 1965, in support of allotments from his pay. In the audit and settlement of the accounts of any certifying or disbursing officer of the United States, credit shall be given for the amount for which liability is relieved by this section.

SEC. 2. The Secretary of the Treasury shall pay, out of any money in the Treasury not otherwise appropriated, to Specialist Five Ronald J. Olson, United States Army, retired, an amount equal to the sum certified to the Secretary of the Treasury by the Secretary of the Army as the aggregate of amounts paid to the United States by Ronald J. Olson, or withheld by the United States from amounts otherwise due him, on account of the liability referred to in the first section of this Act. No part of the amount appropriated in this section shall be paid or delivered to or received by any agent or attorney on account of services rendered in connection with this claim, and the same shall be unlawful, any contract to the contrary notwithstanding. Any person violating the provisions of this section shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof shall be fined in any sum not exceeding \$1,000.
