## AN ACT

For the relief of Doctor Marshall Ku.

November 5, 1966  
[S. 769]

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,* That, for the purposes of the Immigration and Nationality Act, Doctor Marshall Ku shall be held and considered to have been lawfully admitted to the United States for permanent residence as of October 30, 1951.

## Private Law 89-447

## AN ACT

For the relief of Fred E. Starr.

November 5, 1966  
[S. 1068]

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,* That, notwithstanding any other provision of law, the Secretary of the Air Force is authorized and directed to provide for the transportation of the household goods and personal effects of Fred E. Starr, a former employee of the Department of the Air Force assigned to Headquarters, Pacific Air Force, Hawaii, from his last oversea duty station, Honolulu, Hawaii, to his permanent residence in Menomonee Falls, Wisconsin, and to pay, out of any funds available for the payment of transporting household goods, any unpaid storage charges which may be due on such household goods and personal effects at the time of shipment.

SEC. 2. The Secretary of the Treasury is authorized and directed to pay, out of any money in the Treasury not otherwise appropriated, to the said Fred E. Starr, the sum of \$1,095.28 in full satisfaction of all his claims against the United States for expenses incurred by the said Fred E. Starr in storing the household goods and personal effects referred to in section 1 of this Act prior to the shipment thereof authorized by this Act. No part of the amount appropriated in this Act shall be paid or delivered to or received by any agent or attorney on account of services rendered in connection with this claim, and the same shall be unlawful, any contract to the contrary notwithstanding. Any person violating the provisions of this Act shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof shall be fined in any sum not exceeding \$1,000.

## AN ACT

To provide for the conveyance of certain mineral interests of the United States in seventy-nine and one-hundred-and-eighty-four one-thousandths acres located near Orangeburg, South Carolina, to Allen E. Dominick, the owner of such property.

[S. 1101]

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,* That the Secretary of the Interior shall convey to Allen E. Dominick, of Orangeburg, South Carolina, all right, title, and interest reserved to the United States in and to seventy-nine and one-hundred-and-eighty-four one-thousandths acres located near Orangeburg, South Carolina, and more

particularly described in a deed, dated January 30, 1964, and recorded in the office of the clerk of the court of common pleas and general sessions of Orangeburg County, South Carolina, in deed book 260, page 500, upon payment to the United States by or on behalf of the said Allen E. Dominick of the fair market value thereof, if any, as determined by the Secretary, as of the time the conveyance is made and the administrative costs of making the conveyance. No conveyance shall be made unless such payment is made within one year after the Secretary notifies him of the total amount to be paid.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,* That, for the purposes of the Immigration and Nationality Act, Doctor Rafael Pedro Martinez Torres shall be held and considered to have been lawfully admitted to the United States for permanent residence as of September 25, 1961.

For the relief of Merritt A. Seefeldt and August C. Seefeldt.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,* That Merritt A. Seefeldt and August C. Seefeldt of Clark, South Dakota, are hereby relieved of all liability to pay to the United States the sum of \$539.73, representing the amount assessed against them for alleged quality deficiencies in wheat which was delivered by the said Merritt A. and August C. Seefeldt in settlement of the price support loan (number 47-013-173A) made to them by the Commodity Credit Corporation in carrying out the 1962 price support program for wheat.

For the relief of Fun Wat Hoy.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,* That, for the purposes of the Immigration and Nationality Act, Fun Wat Hoy shall be held and considered to have been lawfully admitted to the United States for permanent residence as of the date of the enactment of this Act, upon payment of the required visa fee. Upon the granting of permanent residence to such alien as provided for in this Act, the Secretary of State shall instruct the proper quota-control officer to deduct one number from the appropriate quota for the first year that such quota is available.
