AN ACT

For the relief of Mrs. M. M. Richwine.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, That the Secretary of the Treasury is authorized and directed to pay, out of any money in the Treasury not otherwise appropriated, to Mrs. M. M. Richwine of Chevy Chase, Maryland, the sum of \$100, in full settlement of her claim against the United States for not paying, by reason of lapse of time, a \$100 United States postal money order held by her, numbered 18706, dated July 13, 1944. No part of the amount appropriated in this Act shall be paid or delivered to or received by any agent or attorney on account of services rendered in connection with this claim, and the same shall be unlawful, any contract to the contrary notwithstanding. Any person violating the provisions of this Act shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof shall be fined in any sum not exceeding \$1,000.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, That the time Roy A. Parker resided abroad between April 19, 1960, and April 19, 1964, accompanying his stepfather who was stationed in France on an official assignment with the United States Army, shall be held and considered to be residence and physical presence in the United States for the purposes of section 316 of the Immigration and Nationality Act.
