Private Law 91-76

AN ACT

For the relief of Mrs. Marjorie Zuck.

February 2, 1970
[S. 476]

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, That, for purposes of determining the entitlement of Mrs. Marjorie Zuck, Rural Route 1, Watson, Missouri, to benefits under title II of the Social Security Act for the months after October 1965, on the basis of the wages and self-employment income of Emery Zuck (social security account numbered (487-42-7467)) if the said Mrs. Marjorie Zuck files application for such benefits within six months after the date of the enactment of this Act, the marriage entered into by the said Mrs. Marjorie Zuck and Emery Zuck on November 26, 1921, shall be held and considered to have been a valid marriage.

AN ACT

For the relief of Yau Ming Chinn (Gon Ming Loo).

February 11, 1970
[S. 1438]

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, That, in the administration of the Immigration and Nationality Act, Yau Ming Chinn (Gon Ming Loo) may be classified as a child within the meaning of section 101(b)(1)(F) of such Act, upon approval of a petition filed in his behalf by Mrs. Fanny Loo Chinn, a citizen of the United States, pursuant to section 204 of such Act: *Provided,* That no brothers or sisters to the said Yau Ming Chinn (Gon Ming Loo) shall thereafter, by virtue of such relationship, be accorded any right, privilege, or status under the Immigration and Nationality Act.
