XXVTH CONGRESS OF THE INTERALLIED
CONFEDERATION OF RESERVE OFFICERS

Whereas the Interallied Confederation of Reserve Officers (CIOR), an association of reserve officers from twelve of the nations comprising the North Atlantic Treaty Organization, will hold its XXVth Congress at Washington, District of Columbia, August 7 through August 13, 1972; and

Whereas the Reserve Officers Association of the United States and the Department of Defense will serve as joint hosts to such XXVth Congress; and

Whereas the United States, through the Department of Defense, will conduct military competitions in conjunction with and as a constituent part of such XXVth Congress: Now, therefore, be it

Resolved by the Senate (the House of Representatives concurring), That the Congress of the United States extends to the Interallied Confederation of Reserve Officers a cordial welcome to the United States on the occasion of the XXVth Congress of that organization to be held in Washington, District of Columbia, August 7 through August 13, 1972, and commends the joint effort of the Reserve Officers Association of the United States and the Department of Defense in hosting the XXVth Congress of that organization, and urges all departments and agencies of the Government to cooperate with and assist the Interallied Confederation of Reserve Officers in carrying out its activities and programs during the period referred to above.

CONGRESSIONAL ADJOURNMENT IN
EXCESS OF THREE DAYS OR SINE DIE

Resolved by the House of Representatives (the Senate concurring), That notwithstanding the provisions of sec. 132(a) of the Legislative Reorganization Act of 1946 (2 U.S.C. 198), as amended by section 461 of the Legislative Reorganization Act of 1970 (P.L. 91-510; 84 Stat. 1193), the House of Representatives and the Senate shall not adjourn for a period in excess of three days, or adjourn sine die, until both Houses of Congress have adopted a concurrent resolution providing either for an adjournment (in excess of three days) to a day certain, or for adjournment sine die.
