An Act

For the relief of Christine Donnelly.

Aug. 14, 1976

[H.R. 7404]

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, That Christine Donnelly shall be held and considered to have satisfied the requirements of section 316 of the Immigration and Nationality Act relating to required periods of residence and physical presence within the United States and, notwithstanding the provisions of section 310(d) of that Act, she may be naturalized at any time after the date of enactment of this Act if she is otherwise eligible for naturalization under the Immigration and Nationality Act.

Private Law 94-85 94th Congress

An Act

For the relief of Luigi Santaniello.

Aug. 14, 1976

[H.R. 7494]

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, That, notwithstanding the provision of section 212(a)(9) of the Immigration and Nationality Act, Luigi Santaniello may be issued a visa and admitted to the United States for permanent residence if he is found to be otherwise admissible under the provisions of that Act: *Provided*, That this exemption shall apply only to a ground for exclusion of which the Department of State or the Department of Justice had knowledge prior to the enactment of the Act.
