To designate the United States Federal Building in New Haven, Connecticut, as the "Robert N. Giaimo Federal Building".

Robert N.

Designation.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, That the building at 150 Court Street, New Haven, Connecticut (commonly known as the Federal Building), shall hereafter be known, called, and designated as the "Robert N. Giaimo Federal Building". Any reference in any law, map, regulation, document, record, or other paper of the United States to such building shall be deemed to be a reference to the Robert N. Giaimo Federal Building.

Effective date.

SEC. 2. This Act shall be effective on January 4, 1981.
