To designate the Federal Building-United States Courthouse in Sacramento, California, the "John E. Moss Federal Building-United States Courthouse".

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, That the Federal Building-United States Courthouse, 650 Capitol Mall, Sacramento, California, shall hereafter be known and designated as the "John E. Moss Federal Building-United States Courthouse". Any reference in a law, map, regulation, document, record, or other paper of the United States to such building shall be held to be a reference to the "John E. Moss Federal Building-United States Courthouse".

carry out the provisions of this Act, not to exceed \$200,000 for the fiscal year ending September 30, 1981, and not to exceed \$25,000,000 for the fiscal year ending September 30, 1982, of which amount not less than \$2,000,000 shall be made directly available to the National Climate Program Office in the form of a budget item separate from the activities of the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration.

Sec. 2. Section 607 of the National Weather Modification Policy Act of 1976 (16 U.S.C. 3707) is amended to read as follows: "There are authorized to be appropriated \$150,000 for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1977; \$200,000 each for the fiscal years 1978 through 1980; and \$100,000 for the fiscal year ending September 30, 1981, to carry out the provisions of this chapter."
