To name the lock and dam authorized to replace locks and dam 26, Mississippi River, Alton, Illinois, as "Melvin Price Lock and Dam".

Melvin Price

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, That the lock and dam, authorized by section 102 of Public Law 95-502, to replace locks and dam 26, Mississippi River, Alton, Illinois, shall hereafter be known as Melvin Price Lock and Dam. Any law, regulation, map, document, or record of the United States in which such lock and dam is referred to shall be held and considered to refer to such lock and dam as "Melvin Price Lock and Dam".

Effective date.

SEC. 2. This Act shall become effective upon the date of termination of service in the United States Congress of Melvin Price.

Approved December 29, 1981.

Sec. 2. It is the sense of Congress that judicial review should be denied of the Act and of its amendments to the Federal Water Pollution Control Act made by this Act including any amendments made under section 102 of such Act and that the courts in judicial review should not be asked to construe or interpret the provisions of such Act and amendments thereto in such a way as to require any amendments to such Act.

Sec. 27. For purposes of the Federal Water Pollution Control Act and any amendments thereto, the project for publicly owned treatment works for both domestic and industrial waste water shall be eligible for payment from such source as the State or political subdivision in which such project is located shall determine after the date of enactment of this Act.
