CONTRACT TERM: The term of this contract is for the period beginning Date of Award and ending June 30, 2012, plus up to four optional 12-month extension periods that may be added in accordance with the "Option to Extend the Contract Term" clause in this contract.

RESTRICTION ON LOCATION OF PRODUCTION FACILITIES: All production facilities used in the manufacture of the product(s) ordered under the contract must be located within a 30-mile radius of 401 W. Maxwell Blvd., Maxwell AFB, AL 36112-6501.

SPECIAL ATTENTION IS DIRECTED TO THE FOLLOWING ITEMS WHICH DIFFER SIGNIFICANTLY FROM THE PREVIOUS CONTRACT:

SECTION 1.- GENERAL TERMS AND CONDITIONS

GPO CONTRACT TERMS: Any contract which results from this Request for Quotes will be subject to the applicable provisions, clauses, and supplemental specifications of GPO Contract Terms (GPO Pub. 310.2, effective December 1, 1987 (Rev. 6-01)) and GPO Contract Terms, Quality Assurance Through Attributes Program (GPO Pub. 310.1, effective May 1979 (revised August 2002)).

DISPUTES CLAUSE: GPO Publication 310.2, GPO Contract Terms, Contract Clause 5. Disputes, is hereby replaced with the June 2008 clause found at www.gpo.gov/pdfs/vendors/contractdisputes.pdf. This clause cancels and supersedes any other disputes language currently included in existing contractual actions.

QUALITY ASSURANCE LEVELS AND STANDARDS: The following levels and standards shall apply to these specifications:

Product Quality Levels:

- (a) Printing (page related) Attributes -- Level II.
- (b) Finishing (item related) Attributes -- Level II.

Inspection Levels (from ANSI/ASQC Z1.4):

- (a) Nondestructive Tests - General Inspection Level I.

*In the event that the Specified Standard is waived the Alternate Standard will serve as its replacement.

OPTION TO EXTEND THE CONTRACT TERM: The Government has the option to extend the term of this contract for a period of 12 months by written notice to the contractor not later than 30 days before the contract expires. If the Government exercises this option, the extended contract shall be considered to include this clause, except, the total duration of the contract may not exceed five years as a result of, and including, any extension(s) added under this clause. Further extension may be negotiated under the "Extension of Contract Term" clause. See also "Economic Price Adjustment" for periodic pricing revision.

EXTENSION OF CONTRACT TERM: At the request of the Government, the term of any contract resulting from this solicitation may be extended for such period of time as may be mutually agreeable to the GPO and the contractor.

ECONOMIC PRICE ADJUSTMENT: The pricing under this contract shall be adjusted in accordance with this clause, provided that in no event will any pricing adjustment be made that would exceed the maximum permissible under any law in effect at the time of the adjustment. There will be no adjustment for orders placed during the first period specified below. Pricing will thereafter be eligible for adjustment during the second and any succeeding performance period(s). For each performance period after the first, a percentage figure will be calculated as described below and that figure will be the economic price adjustment for that entire next period. Pricing adjustments under this clause are not applicable to reimbursable postage or transportation costs, or to paper, if paper prices are subject to adjustment by separate clause elsewhere in this contract.

For the purpose of this clause, performance under this contract will be divided into successive periods. The first period will extend from the beginning of the contract to June 30, 2012, and the second and any succeeding period(s) will extend for 12 months from the end of the last preceding period, except that the length of the final period may vary. The first day of the second and any succeeding period(s) will be the effective date of the economic price adjustment for that period.

Pricing adjustments in accordance with this clause will be based on changes in the seasonally adjusted index "Commodities Less Food" under the Special Indexes category on "Table 2 –Consumer Price Index For All Urban Consumers (CPI-U): U.S. City Average, by expenditure category and commodity and service group" published monthly in the CPI Detailed Report by the U.S. Department of Labor, Bureau of Labor Statistics.

The economic price adjustment will be the percentage difference between Index averages as specified in this paragraph. An index called the variable index will be calculated by averaging the monthly Indexes from the 12-month interval ending three (3) months prior to the beginning of the period being considered for adjustment. This average is then compared to the average of the monthly Indexes for the 12-month interval ending 3 months prior to the beginning of the contract, called the base index. The percentage change (plus or minus) of the variable index from the base index will be the economic price adjustment for the period being considered for adjustment.

The Government will notify the contractor by contract modification specifying the percentage increase or decrease to be applied to invoices for orders placed during the period indicated. The contractor shall apply the percentage increase or decrease against the total price of the invoice less reimbursable postage or transportation costs and separately adjusted paper prices. Payment discounts shall be applied after the invoice price is adjusted.

ASSIGNMENT OF JACKETS, PURCHASE AND PRINT ORDERS: A GPO jacket number will be assigned and a purchase order issued to the contractor to cover work performed. The purchase order will be supplemented by an individual "Print Order" for each job placed with the contractor. The print order, when issued, will indicate the quantity to be produced and any other information pertinent to the particular order.

PREAWARD SURVEY: In order to determine the responsibility of the prime contractor or any subcontractor, the Government reserves the right to conduct an on-site preaward survey at the contractor's/subcontractor's facility or to require other evidence of technical, production, managerial, financial, and similar abilities to perform, prior to the award of a contract.

PAYMENT: Submit all billing to: Comptroller, Stop FMCE, Financial Management Service, U.S. Government Printing Office, Washington, D.C. 20401. (NOTE: GPO recommends using the Contractor Fax Billing System. Please visit the GPO web-site, <http://winapps.access.gpo.gov/fms/vouchers/barcode/instructions.html>, for instructions.)

Additionally, the contractor is required to submit a photocopy of the billing, along with one printed sample, to GPO, ARPPPO, 1888 Emery St. NW, Suite 110, Atlanta, GA 30318-2542 ATTN: Program No. 1443-S. (Failure to do so may result in nonpayment.)

ORDERING: Items to be furnished under the contract shall be ordered by the issuance of print orders by the Government. Orders may be issued under the contract from Date of Award through June 30, 2012, plus for such additional period(s) as the contract is extended. All print orders issued hereunder are subject to the terms and conditions of the contract. The contract shall control in the event of conflict with any print order. A print order shall be "issued" for purposes of the contract, when it is either deposited in the U.S. Postal Service mail or otherwise furnished to the contractor in conformance with the schedule.

REQUIREMENTS: This is a requirements contract for the items and for the period specified herein. Shipment/delivery of items or performance of work shall be made only as authorized by orders issued in

accordance with the clause entitled "Ordering". The quantities of items specified herein are estimates only, and are not purchased hereby. Except as may be otherwise provided in this contract, if the Government's requirements for the items set forth herein do not result in orders in the amounts or quantities described as "estimated", it shall not constitute the basis for an equitable price adjustment under this contract.

Except as otherwise provided in this contract, the Government shall order from the contractor all the items set forth which are required to be purchased by the Government activity identified on page 1.

The Government shall not be required to purchase from the contractor, requirements in excess of the limit on total orders under this contract, if any.

Orders issued during the effective period of this contract and not completed within that time shall be completed by the contractor within the time specified in the order, and the rights and obligations of the contractor and the Government respecting those orders shall be governed by the terms of this contract to the same extent as if completed during the effective period of this contract.

If shipment/delivery of any quantity of an item covered by the contract is required by reason of urgency prior to the earliest date that shipment/delivery may be specified under this contract, and if the contractor will not accept an order providing for the accelerated shipment/delivery, the Government may procure this requirement from another source.

The Government may issue orders which provide for shipment/delivery to or performance at multiple destinations.

Subject to any limitations elsewhere in this contract, the contractor shall furnish to the Government all items set forth herein which are called for by print orders issued in accordance with the "Ordering" clause of this contract.

REGULATIONS GOVERNING PROCUREMENT: The U.S. Government Printing Office (GPO) is an office in the legislative branch of the United States Government. Accordingly, the Federal Acquisition Regulation is inapplicable to this, and all GPO procurements. However, the text of certain provisions of the Federal Acquisition Regulation as contained in the Code of Federal Regulations (CFR), are referenced in this solicitation. The offeror should note that only those provisions of the Federal Acquisition Regulation which are specifically incorporated by reference into this solicitation, are applicable.

POLLUTION PREVENTION AND RIGHT-TO-KNOW INFORMATION:

(a) Federal facilities are required to comply with the provisions of the Emergency Planning and Community Right-to-Know Act of 1986 (EPCRA) (42 U.S.C. 11001-11050) and the Pollution Prevention Act of 1990 (PPA) (42 U.S.C. 13101-13109).

(b) During performance, in whole or in part, of this contract on a Federal facility, the Contractor shall provide to the Contracting Officer all information needed by the Federal facility to comply with the emergency planning reporting requirements of Section 302 of EPCRA, the emergency notice requirements of Section 304 of EPCRA, the list of Material Data Safety Sheets required by Section 311 of EPCRA, the emergency and hazardous chemical inventory forms of Section 312 of EPCRA, and the toxic chemical release inventory of Section 313 of EPCRA, which includes the reduction and recycling information required by Section 6607 of PPA.

SECTION 2.- SPECIFICATIONS

SCOPE: These specifications cover the production of a newsletter requiring such operations as electronic pre-press, proofs, printing (including four-color process), binding, packing, labeling, and distribution.

TITLE: Southern Flyer

Although this is an option year contract, all averages, etc. are based upon one year.

FREQUENCY OF ORDERS: Monthly (an additional order may be required for a "Special Issue").

QUANTITY: Approximately 1,100 to 2,200 copies per order, averaging approximately 1,500 copies.

NUMBER OF PAGES: 12 or 16 pages per order, usually 12 pages.

TRIM SIZE: 8-1/2 x 11".

GOVERNMENT TO FURNISH:

Electronic Media:

Platform: Windows 7.

Storage Media: Usually files will be furnished on CD-R.

Software: Page layout will be furnished via one press-ready pdf file using Adobe Acrobat Distiller, version 5.0.

Note: All operating system and software upgrades (for specified applications) which occur during the term of the contract, must be supported by the contractor.

Fonts: Fonts will be embedded and/or embedded subsets.

NOTE: In the event all fonts have not been embedded and/or embedded as subsets in the PDF, contractor is to notify GPO immediately (404-605-9160, EXT. 103).

Color will be identified as CMYK for all pages.

A black and white laser visual of the furnished electronic files will be provided.

Output is 150 line screen for CMYK and all screens and halftones; and 1200+ dpi for the remainder.

GPO Form 952 (Desktop Publishing - Disk Information).

Mailing addresses for self-mailers will be provided via CD-R. The addresses will be zip code sorted, created using Microsoft Excel.

Print orders.

A supply of blue labels and selection certificates for shipping Departmental Random Copies.

Form 905 (R. 3/90) with labeling and marking specifications.

Performance Records: A *Facsimile Transmission Sheet* will be furnished to the contractor. Information such as the GPO program, jacket, and print-order numbers, quantity, and date of shipment must be filled in by the contractor and faxed/mailed to the GPO on the day shipment is due.

Identification markings such as register marks, ring folios, rubber stamped jacket numbers, commercial identification marks of any kind, etc., except GPO imprint, form number, and revision date, carried on copy, film, or electronic media, must not print on finished product.

CONTRACTOR TO FURNISH: All materials and operations, other than those listed under "Government to Furnish," necessary to produce the product(s) in accordance with these specifications.

ELECTRONIC PREPRESS/FILMS: Prior to image processing, the contractor shall perform a basic check (preflight) of the furnished media and publishing files to assure correct output of the required reproduction image. Any errors, media damage, or data corruption that might interfere with the proper file image processing must be reported to the Term Contract Section, Atlanta RPPO, 404-605-9160, Ext. 103.

The contractor shall create or alter any necessary trapping, set proper screen angles and screen frequency, and define file output selection for the imaging device being utilized. Furnished files must be imaged as necessary to meet the assigned quality level.

The contractor shall make all revisions to the electronic files. Prior to making revisions, the contractor shall copy the furnished files and make all changes to the copy.

Films are not required; however, newsletters must be produced using the offset printing method. High resolution digital printing (computer to plate) is acceptable **as long as Quality Level 2 is maintained**. Inkjet printing or color copying (toner) is not acceptable. If, at the contractor's option, films are used, the Government will not pay for new films due to Author's Alterations. The Government will pay for making digital corrections - not for new films.

At the completion of the order, the contractor must provide the Government with storage media (same type of storage media as was originally furnished) containing corrected files in the same format as the original Government furnished material.

PROOFS: All orders will require one complete digital color CONTENT proof created using the same Raster Image Processor (RIP) that will be used to produce the product. Proof shall be collated with all elements in proper position (not pasted up), imaged face and back, trimmed and folded to the finished size/format of the product.

Additionally, all orders require a digital one-piece composite color CONTRACT proofs on the actual production stock (i.e. Kodak Approval, Screen TrueRite, Polaroid PolaProof, Latran Prediction, CreoSpectrum, or Fuji Final Proof) with a minimum resolution of 2400 x 2400 dpi are required created using the same Raster Image Processor (RIP) that will be used to produce the product. Proofs must have all elements in proper position (indicate margins). Proofs will be used for color match on the press and must show dot structure. Sublimation, inkjet, photographic, and overlay proofs are not acceptable.

Proofs must contain color control bars for each color of ink on the sheet. Control bars must be placed parallel to the press's ink rollers. The control bars (such as Brunner, GATF, GRETAG, or RIT) must show areas consisting of minimum 3/16" x 3/16" solid color patches; tint patches of 25, 50 and 75%; dot gain scale; and gray balance patches for process color (if applicable). These areas must be repeated consecutively across the sheet. The make and model number of the proofing system utilized shall be furnished with the proofs.

IT IS UNDERSTOOD THAT THE PROOFS SUPPLIED UNDER THIS CONTRACT WILL MATCH THE FINAL OUTPUT.

All proofs will be read in the contractor's plant unless otherwise indicated on the print order.

The contractor will be responsible for performing all necessary proofreading to insure that the proofs are in conformity with the copy submitted.

If any contractor's errors are serious enough in the opinion of the GPO to require revised proofs, the revised proofs are to be provided at no expense to the Government. No extra time can be allowed for this reproofing; such operations must be accomplished within the original production schedule allotted in the specifications.

The contractor must not print prior to receipt of an "OK to print."

NOTE: Contractor furnished proof approval letters will not be recognized for proof approval/disapproval. Only GPO generated proof letters will be recognized for proof approval/disapproval.

STOCK/PAPER: The specifications of all paper furnished must be in accordance with those listed herein or listed for the corresponding JCP Code numbers in the "Government Paper Specification Standards" in effect at the time of award.

NOTICE: Copies of the "Government Paper Specifications Standards" are for sale, on a subscription basis, by the Superintendent of Documents, U.S. Government Printing Office, Washington, D.C. 20402; or available in PDF format on the GPO web site.

All text paper used in each copy must be of a uniform shade. **All coated paper must have the grain parallel to the spine and must not crack on fold.**

White No. 1 Coated Text, Gloss Finish, grammage 120 g/m² (basis weight: 80 lbs per 500 sheets, 25 x 38"), equal to JCP Code A181.

PRINTING: Print head-to-head in four-color process.

Line illustrations and background screens are scattered throughout each issue (with an average of 3 per issue).

Pages generally do not bleed; however, 3 to 4 issues per year may require full coverage bleeds as indicated on the print order. Background must have no streaking or tonal variations.

Must be printed on a press capable of printing four colors in a single pass through the press (minimum four printing units).

On occasion, facing pages may print to and must align across the bind.

INK: If lithographic ink is used in the performance of this contract, the ink shall contain not less than the following percentages of vegetable oil: (a) news ink, 40 percent; (b) sheet-fed and forms ink, 20 percent; and (c) heat-set ink, 10 percent. High quality color process printing on high speed heat-set presses is excepted when slow drying time significantly increases production costs.

MARGINS: Margins will be as indicated on the print order or furnished copy. Occasional orders may require bleeds (see PRINTING).

BINDING: Saddle-wire stitch in two places and trim three sides. Each product must contain complete 4-page signature after trimming. Single leaves connected with a lip (i.e., binding stub) to left or right side of stitches will not be allowed.

PACKING: Bulk deliveries: Pack in shipping containers not to exceed 40 pounds when fully packed.

Individual mailing containers for domestic use shall have a minimum bursting strength of 200 pounds per square inch or a minimum edge crush test (ECT) of 32 pounds per inch width.

LABELING: Reproduce shipping container label from furnished copy, fill in appropriate blanks and attach to shipping containers.

At contractor's option, affix individual address labels to or print the furnished addresses directly onto the final page of the copies mailed as self-mailers.

DEPARTMENTAL RANDOM COPIES (BLUE LABEL): All orders must be divided into equal sublots in accordance with the chart below. A random copy must be selected from each subplot. Do not choose copies from the same general area in each subplot. The contractor will be required to execute a statement furnished by GPO certifying that copies were selected as directed. The random copies constitute a part of the total quantity ordered, and no additional charge will be allowed.

These randomly selected copies must be packed separately and identified by a special government-furnished blue label, affixed to each affected container. The container and its contents shall be recorded separately on all shipping documents and sent to the address listed under "SCHEDULE".

A copy of the PRINT ORDER/SPECIFICATION and a signed Government-furnished certificate of selection, must be included.

QUALITY ASSURANCE RANDOM COPIES: In addition to the Departmental Random Copies (Blue Label), the contractor is required to submit quality assurance random copies to test for compliance against the specifications. The contractor must divide the entire order into equal sublots, per the chart below, and select a copy from a different general area of each subplot. The contractor will be required to execute a statement furnished by GPO certifying that copies were selected as directed. Copies will be paid for at the running rate offered in the contractor's bid and their cost will not be a consideration for award.

Business Reply Mail labels will be furnished for mailing the quality assurance random copies. The copies are to be mailed at the same time as the first scheduled shipment. A copy of the print order must be included.

A U.S. Postal Service approved Certificate of Mailing, identified by Program, Jacket and Print Order numbers, must be furnished with billing as evidence of mailing.

DISTRIBUTION: Mail f.o.b. contractor's city one copy to each address furnished by the agency. It is anticipated that approximately 90% of the copies on each order will require mailing as self-mailers.

The contractor is to apply the appropriate postage to each mailing. Contractor will be reimbursed for postage by submitting a properly completed Postal Service form (or equivalent) with the voucher for billing.

All mailing shall be made at the First Class rate.

All copies mailed must conform to the appropriate regulations in the U.S. Postal Service manuals for "Domestic Mail" or "International Mail" as applicable.

Deliver balance of order f.o.b. destination to address listed under "SCHEDULE".

Upon completion of each order, all Government furnished materials must be returned to the address listed under "SCHEDULE".

All expenses incidental to the pickup and return of furnished materials, proofs, and furnishing samples must be borne by the contractor.

RECEIPT FOR DELIVERY: Contractor must furnish their own receipts for delivery. These receipts must include the GPO jacket, program, and print order numbers; total quantity delivered, number of cartons, and quantity per carton; date delivery made; and signature of the Government agent accepting delivery. The original copy of this receipt must accompany the contractor's billing for payment.

SCHEDULE: Adherence to this schedule must be maintained. Contractor must not start production of any job prior to receipt of the individual print order (GPO Form 2511). (NOTE: Usually the files will be uploaded to the contractor's FTP site and the GPO Form 2511 will be faxed on the same day.)

No definite schedule for pickup of material can be predetermined.

The Government will notify the contractor via e-mail that the files are available on the ftp site, and will read the proofs at the contractor's plant. However, occasionally furnished materials and proofs must be picked up from and delivered to: 908th Airlift Wing Public Affairs Office, Bldg. 1056, 401 West Maxwell Blvd., Maxwell AFB, AL, 36112-6501, Attn: Lt. Col. Jerry W. Lobb.

The following schedules begin upon notification of the availability of print order and furnished material.

The numbers under the column headed "WD After" represent the number of workdays allowed to complete that certain part of the schedule.

*Usually the proofs will be read at the contractor's plant; however, at the Government's option, the contractor may be required to deliver the proofs to the above address, and to pick them up once OK'd. Contractor is to contact the Government when proofs are available. Contact name and number will be indicated on the print order. Government will give OK the SAME DAY if read in the contractor's plant.

NOTE: Occasional last minute changes may be required.

The ship/deliver date indicated on the print order is the date products ordered f.o.b. destination must be delivered to the destination(s) specified, and products ordered f.o.b. contractor's city must be delivered to the U. S. Postal Service for mailing.

Unscheduled material such as shipping documents, receipts or instructions, delivery lists, labels, etc., will be furnished with the order or shortly thereafter. In the event such information is not received in due time, the contractor will not be relieved of any responsibility in meeting the shipping schedule because of failure to request such information.

SECTION 3.- DETERMINATION OF AWARD

The Government will determine the lowest quote by applying the prices offered in the "Schedule of Prices" to the following units of production which are the estimated requirements to produce one year's orders under this contract.
