Now, GPO creates secure cards that verify the identity of those who cross a border, receive Medicare benefits, or display a law enforcement badge. John Kerwin, Marketing Communications Manager for Security & Intelligent Documents, will provide a snapshot of the latest GPO secure credential projects. Doug Ward, Senior Printing Specialist, will discuss the materials and methods used in secure card engineering. Doug will illustrate some of the printed and electronic security features that make GPO credentials tough to counterfeit, but easy to authenticate.
- **June 30<sup>th</sup> GPO Federal Digital System (FDsys)**  
GPO's Federal Digital System (FDsys) provides public access to Government information submitted by Congress and Federal agencies and preserved as technology changes. GPO is committed to ensuring that you can easily locate information within FDsys. Currently on GPO Access, publications are stored in over 4,000 separate databases — with FDsys you are able to perform a search across all content. After you perform a search, filters are generated which allow you to easily narrow down your results.
- **July 22<sup>nd</sup> GPO Quality Control for Procured Printing (Tentative)**

The GPO is just several blocks north of the Capitol Building on North Capitol St. between G and H Streets. The GPO consists of four buildings, three on the west side of North Capitol and one on the east. The main building is located on the corner of North Capitol and H St.

##### **Arriving by train:**

The GPO is located just three city blocks from Union Station. Union station is a focal point of transportation in Washington DC with a Metro stop on the red line and an Amtrak station, which is the last stop for Maryland's MARC commuter trains and Virginia's VRE trains.

##### **Arriving by metro:**

GPO is located next door to Union Station, a major hub for the metro trains. Commuters can access GPO by taking any line to the Union Station stop (red line) and walking to GPO. ##### **Arriving by bus:**


There are a variety of bus stops near Union Station. Also, there are several bus stops located directly in front of the GPO. You can find schedules at <http://www.wmata.com/>.
