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GPO SEEKS DIGITAL PRINTING EQUIPMENT

WASHINGTON—The U.S. Government Printing Office (GPO) released a Request for Information (RFI) seeking opinions on advanced print technology used to produce Congressional and Federal agency publications. The RFI is looking for the types of new technology that will reduce paper waste and provide cost-effective solutions for short and medium-run jobs, such as the *Congressional Record* and *Federal Register*. GPO would like to use these opinions to replace the agency's aging and obsolete heavy metal equipment in the plant. The agency will hold an Industry Day at GPO headquarters in Washington, D.C. on September 9th to gather information from printing manufacturers and suppliers.
